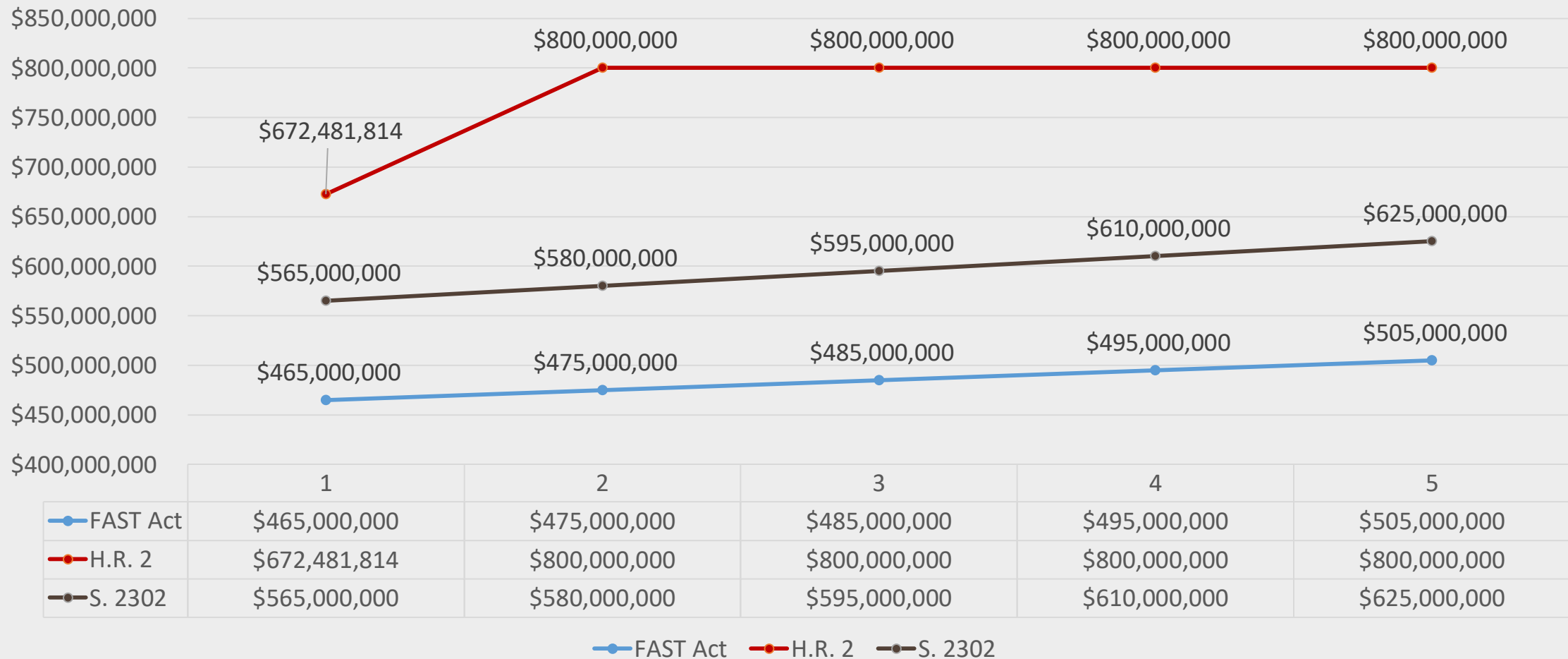


Legislation

- S. 1211 – Addressing Underdeveloped and Tribally Operated Streets Act
- S. 2302 – America’s Transportation Infrastructure Act (ATIA)
- S. 3359 – Tribal Transportation Equity and Transparency Improvement Act
- H.R. 2 – Moving Forward Act (INVEST in America Act)

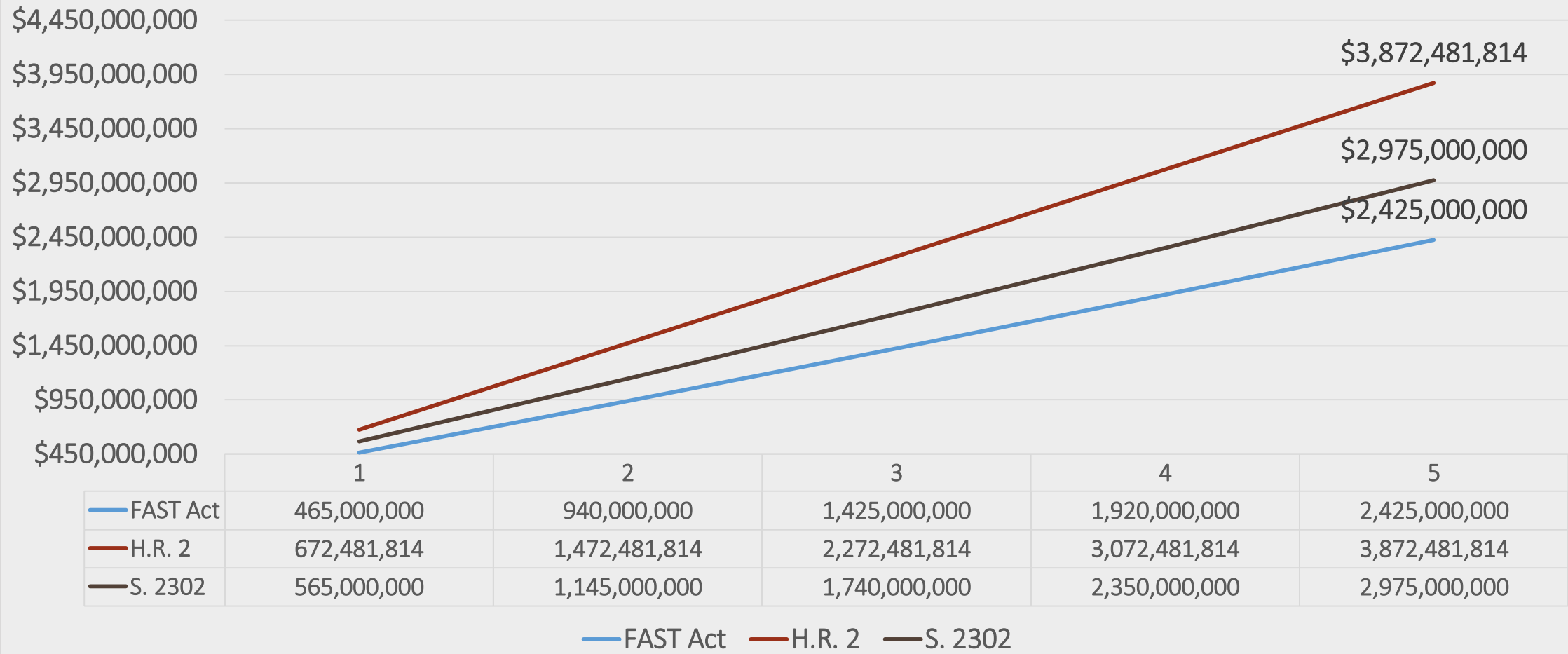


TTP Funding Comparison

Key Provisions

- Office of Tribal Government Affairs
- Tribal High Priority Projects Program
- Bridges Funding
- BIA Road Maintenance Funding
- Public Transportation on Indian Reservations (Tribal Transit Program)
- Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects (or Federal Lands and Tribal Major Projects, under H.R. 2)
- Alternative Contracting Methods
- Federal Obligation Limitation



Congressional Outlook

- Lame Duck Congressional session
- One year extension granted by the first Continuing Resolution
- January special Senate election in Georgia
- The House and Senate have two different bill structures
- Missing parts (Senate's Tribal Transit piece)
- Still no “pay for”
- This delay presents further opportunity
- Your voice makes a difference
